Balazs, whose real name was Herbert Bauer, was a Hungarian Jewish filmmaker, film theorist, reviewer, screenwriter, and author. A prolific writer and political activist, Balazs was expelled from his native land in 1919 for his support of a fledgling communist government, and spent much of the rest of his life in exile, first in Austria and Germany.
